



Starting off in the Upper Vinschgau valley, the route along the eastern shore of Lake Reschensee takes you to the steeple of former 14th century Romanesque church. The steeple soaring out of the lake's waters is the witness to the events that unfolded in Curon. The town was destroyed after a reservoir flooding. When you leave Lake Reschensee and the smaller Lake Haidermeer, be ready for the downhill. Continue your bike tour beneath the 3,905 m high Ortler mountain, past Burgeis/Burgusio and to Glurns/Glorenza, the smallest village in South Tyrol. The flooded area of the Prader Sand biotope makes you feel like you are in the Old West. Along the stretch of cycle route through the village of Laas/Lasa, you can catch sight of the marble quarry. In fact, Laas has been exporting its white marble worldwide for a long time.

★ Visit the mystical Tartscher Bühl hill, a beauty spot overlooking Mals/Malles and Glurns/Glorenza, with its well-preserved medieval battlements.

💡 On one day in September every year, the road leading up to the Stilfserjoch Pass amidst the National Park is closed to all traffic – except cyclists.

Direct na de start in het bovenste dal Vinschgau voert de rit via de oostelijke oever van het Reschenseeje naar de iconische kerktoren, de plek waar ooit een 14-eeuwse Romaanse kerk stond. Het uitzicht is onwerkelijk mooi, net als dit bijzondere plaatje. De kerk en het dorp Graun/Curon werden onder water gezet om hier een stuwwerke te maken. Wanneer je voorbij het Reschensee en het kleinere Haidermeer fiets, hou je stuur dan goed vast. Hier gaat de rit grotendeels bergwaarts. Volg de route – met uitzicht op de Ortler, de hoogste berg van Zuid-Tirol (3.905 m) – via Burgeis/Burgusio naar Glurns/Glorenza, het kleinste dorpje van Zuid-Tirol. Wanneer je door het kale landschap van Prader Sand rijdt, waar je even in het wilde westen. Omgeven door steengroeven, passeer je het dorp Laas/Lasa, waar al eeuwenlang het zuiverste marmer van Europa wordt gedolven, en over de hele wereld wordt verkocht.

★ Vervolg je tocht te voet of Glurns naar de mystieke Tartscher Bühl, een spannend uitkijkpunt over Mals/Malles en de rivieren en de volledig bewaard gebleven stadsmuur uit de middeleeuwen.

💡 Elk jaar in september is de weg naar de Stilfserpas in het midden van het Nationaal Park dan uitgesloten geopend voor fietsers.

The route meanders through fields, forests, orchards, urban areas and is mostly downhill. Be ready to cycle into headwind on summer days, strong winds cool down temperatures and create a favorable climate for the growth of apricots. Not only the sights in the valley are worth a visit, but also the thermal baths in Naturns/Naturno and the cool waters of Lake Goldrainer See. When you cycle further south, the mountainous landscape is characterized by Mediterranean features, like palms and cypresses.

★ The breathtaking Partschins waterfall are a real natural wonder. You can get here by bus, line 265.

💡 The old water canals were used to transport water to households in Vinschgau and Meran/Merano. Today, people walk along the old irrigation canals to enjoy the quiet hiking trails winding through forests, orchards and vineyards. The traditional irrigation system in the Obervinschgau valley has been declared Intangible Cultural Heritage Site since 2023.

Door velden en bossen, boomgaarden en stedelijke gebieden: deze route leidt je door een gevareerde landschap. Hoewel de weg vooral bergwaarts gaat, kan de Vinschgau-wind je flink tegenwerken. In de hete zomermaanden zorgt deze bergwind voor frisse verkoeling en speelt een belangrijke rol bij het vissen van de Vinschgauer abrikozen. Langs de route kom je zowel culturele hoogtepunten als ontspanning tegen. Neem bijvoorbeeld het thermale water van de thermen van Naturns/Naturno, een gezellige pauzeplaats voor de Goldrainer See. Aan het einde van de rit loopt het berglandschap over in een mediterrane omgeving. Een prachtige plek voor een wandeling tussen de palmbeien en cipressen.

★ De Partschins/Parcines waterval is een indrukwekkend natuurspektakel, waar je geniet van verfrissing en zuivere lucht. Bereikbaar met buslijn 265.

💡 In het Vinschgau en het gebied rondom Meran/Merano werden in het verleden 'waaile' (irrigatiekanalen) aangelegd om de bebouwde weiden en velden te bevoeden. Terwijlvoegd zijn de vlaakte paden langs deze irrigatiekanalen populaire wandelpaden, die je dwars door bosjes, appelboomgaarden en wijngaarden leiden. Je vindt deze waaileweg in Algund/Lagundo en Marlengo/Marlingo.

De landelijke omgeving - tussen de grootste steden in de regio - is prachtig en wordt gekenmerkt door vele appelboomgaarden. Ook de kleinere dorpen zijn een bezoek waard: Lana met haar levendige centrum, Tisens/Tesimo en Prissian/Prissiano gelegen op een zonnige heuvel, of Gargazon/Gargazone met haar natuurlijke zwembad. De route langs de Etsch verigt niet veel inspanning, want gaat altijd licht bergwaarts. Je kunt deze etappe als uitgangspunt nemen voor een kleine omweg. Hier wandel je langs de oude 'Waalwege' irrigatiekanalen, dwars door de panoramische bergen. Onderweg kom je verschillende culturele bezienswaardigheden tegen. Vergeet niet te proeven van de culinaire hoogtepunten van Terlan/Terlano, zoals de lokale geteelde asperges en award-winnende wijnen.

★ Als je geïnteresseerd bent in historische kastelen en paleizen, zit je hier goed, Vanuit Andrian/Andriano zijn de 'kastelenwandeling' naar kasteel Korb, kasteel Hochepan en de kasteelruine Boymont de moeite waard.

★ Voor Bolzano en omgeving: De kabelbaan van Ritten/Renon brengt je vanuit Bolzano rechtstreeks naar een bergplateau met een geweldig uitzicht. Hier kun je naar de 'aardpiramides' wandelen. De oudste personenkabelbaan ter wereld brengt je naar de 1.100 m hoge Koflerer Berg met talrijke wandelpogelijkheden.

★ Voor het Unterland: Ben je gefascineerd door bedevaartsoriënt? Dan is de Maria Weißenstein echt iets voor jou – voet bereikbaar vanuit Leifers/Vanuit Margreid/Magré kun je naar de Fennbergsee wandelen.

This area of South Tyrol has the best weather for cycling all year round. Not by chance, it was here that South Tyrol's first bike path was built. Cypress and fig trees tell you that you are heading further south. The cycle path is relatively flat and takes you through apple orchards, vineyards and past picturesque houses featuring the Oltradige style. The route continues to wineries with a world-class architecture, offering wines of the highest quality. On your way, you will discover the vineyards of Auer/Ora, Neumarkt/Egna and cycle at the foot of Castelfeder, a trading spot of the Middle Ages, until you reach the border with Trentino. Not only does the route traverse Trentino, but also the Italian language intersects with the South Tyrolean dialect.

★ If after returning to Mals/Malles your legs aren't yet exhausted, you can decide to follow the 'Waalwege' irrigation channel trails, cross through the scenic mountain terrain, and visit cultural points of interest. Don't forget about the local gourmet specialties, such as Terlan/Terlano asparagus and the award-winning local wines.

💡 The cycle path is usually quiet. When you cross the village of Laatsch/Lauders, make a pit stop and try the 'Pala pear' local bread. The pear used in this type of bread is an old protected variety which bears a seal of quality.

Starting off from the pedestrian zone in the heart of bustling Meran/Merano, the route takes you through the Stifiserjoch National Park and its unspoiled nature. The village of Taufers/Tubre in the Münster Valley overlooks the ruins of the Rotund and Reichenberg Castles. Standing at an altitude of 1,500 m, the Rotund Castle is the tallest in South Tyrol.

★ From Kaldenbrunn/Fontanafredre continue uphill to Truden/Trodena, a small village named after the Trudner Horn Nature Park. Mountain bikers can reach Alpine huts at higher altitudes on trails winding through forests. Alternatively, ride from Altriell/Anterivo to Molina (TN), and further east along the old Fleimstalbahn railroad line to Predazzo (TN).

This tour along the River Rambach and through the Münster Valley takes you around the Stifiserjoch National Park and its unspoiled nature. The village of Taufers/Tubre in the Münster Valley overlooks the ruins of the Rotund and Reichenberg Castles. Standing at an altitude of 1,500 m, the Rotund Castle is the tallest in South Tyrol.

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This tour to the Lake Kalterer See is an opportunity to explore more of the countryside. The first stretch of the cycle route along the River Etsch takes you from Bolzano to Frangart/Frangarto, where the road winds gently uphill and through the vineyards until Eppan/Appiano. Take one last look at the town from the well-maintained route: there are not many cyclists and the view is amazing. Both lakes are surrounded by reeds, deciduous trees and pines. Take time to explore one of the forest trails and plan your ride as you wish.

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
